***Proposal Description**

Although Ludington has a beautiful beach, there are times when the beach is not safe to swim, because of the high winds, waves, and rip tides. This development will provide a safe alternative for people to cool off in the summer. It also in turn will stimulate economic revitalization in the 4th ward area.

The Splash Pad will provide permanent improvement of the social infrastructure within a disadvantaged sector of our community by locating within a public park in the 4th Ward. Kids living within this underprivileged area will have easy access to a wonderful social opportunity because it will be within walking distance.

In addition, a loved fishing pier will be able to be reestablished with permanent infrastructure for residents to utilize. A removeable fishing pier was taken out several years prior due to unsafe conditons. The City has bene looking for a way to put in a permanent structure that can withstand the wave action in the area and allow for a longer season of use.



Application Narrative

1. Need for the Project:

Although Ludington has a beautiful beach, there are times when the conditions at the beach is not safe to swim, especially for children, because of the high winds, huge waves, and rip tides. A group of parents formed a Splash Pad Committee to raise money to provide a safe place for kids to have another water experience in the city.

The City of Ludington has approved the building of the Splash Pad at Copeyon Park. This will provide a safe place for people to cool off in the summer if the beach is not safe, or any other time. Not only will this provide a free, safe outdoor play area in an underutilized park, it also in turn will stimulate economic revitalization in the 4th ward area.

The Splash Pad will provide permanent improvement of the social infrastructure within a disadvantaged sector of our community by locating within a public park in the 4th Ward. Kids living within this underprivileged area will have easy access to a wonderful social opportunity because it will be within walking distance. The Splash Pad will offer the community, as a whole, another recreation opportunity for children. Many children from across the City can bike or walk to the location. It further serves to enhance the quality of life of Ludington residents and guests. By drawing more people to Copeyon Park through this unique recreation opportunity, more residents and visitors will utilize the park. With more people congregating in this area businesses will see the value in opening in the storefronts on South Washington Avenue.

The City was forced to remove a fishing dock from Copeyon Park in fall of 2016. The seasonal dock that was pulled in and out each summer by the Department of Public Works had come to the end of its useful and safe life. The dock was not ideal for the area or situation and upon its' removal, the city began looking into options to replace the dock with something more permanent that could extend the use throughout the shoulder seasons for residents.

This project will not be able to be completed in its' entirety in a timely fashion without the assistance of grant funding. The Splash Pad would likely be postponed another year, minimum. The construction of the permanent fishing pier would also likely be postponed for a few years while other avenues of funding were sought and as the City budget allowed for funds to be allocated.

Donations and grants are being sought after for the construction of this project, and some private funding has been committed to a maintenance fund for future needs of the project. Beyond that, the City of Ludington will build the maintenance and upkeep of the park costs into its annual parks budget. With the help of the donated maintenance fund and warranty's the site will be maintained for many years to come.

2. Site Quality:

The Project consists of the installation of a new Splash Pad and a permanent fishing pier at the City owned Copeyon Park. The park encompasses 2.259 acres and abuts Pere Marquette Lake which connects Pere Marquette River (a national scenic river) to Lake Michigan.

The park currently includes a playground, a covered pavilion, a restroom facility, fish cleaning station, and a large parking lot. Across the access road from the park is a City owned boat launch.

This application seeks assistance in funding a Splash Pad near the existing playground and a permanent fishing pier near the bathroom/ fishing cleaning building.

Application Narrative

The Splash Pad design is universally accessible. The Splash Pad is not a continuously running operation, therefore it will need to be "manually" started by the user for the water to begin flowing. The "manual" start button is placed and calibrated so that any user can activate the mechanism. The Splash Pad design in its entirety has been certified by the selected company "Vortex" as Universally Accessible. Those certified plans are attached to this application.

The fishing pier will meet all ADA guidelines and any universal design elements that can be incorporated into the design will be incorporated.

3. Project Quality:

Copeyon Park was once the home of a removeable fishing dock. That dock needed to be removed when it came to the end of its' useful life. The Department of Public Works began looking into options for replacement. Another removeable pier was considered but had high maintenance costs and had to be removed seasonally as the DPW schedule allowed, leaving many weeks without the ability to fish off the dock. A rubble mound structure similar to one abutting Lake Michigan was also considered. Upon conversations with the Engineering firm that designed that structure, an alternate design was recommended that would be better suited for the wave action of Pere Marquette Lake and needs of Copeyon Park. The cost of a permanent fishing pier is higher, but provides residents with less overhead due to removal and maintenance, an extended season and a longer pier. The life span of the fishing pier is far greater than the smaller removeable dock.

The Splash Pad has a lengthy history and one that encompasses looking at a variety of properties and park options throughout the City. Requirements of adequate space, access to city water and possibly sewer or storm sewer, bathroom facilities and parking, were all considerations when choosing the location. Alternate sites were one by one eliminated from the list for a variety of reasons. The Splash Pad parent group along with City Council Committee members and staff visited Copeyon Park and were immediately drawn to the ability to provide all resources needed at this location. Considerations were given to features that would appeal to infants, toddlers and slightly older children. Water flow was also a consideration when choosing those features.

In order to address environmental concerns, water from the Splash Pad has been approved to be put into the storm sewer system and not treated through the City's waste water system. The system for play incorporates an activation button. This allows the water to flow only when a child wants to play at the park. This allows for the conservation of water. The fishing pier will be constructed of wood with steel piles. Wood is economical, easy to work with, flexible, will allow easy maintenance as the pier may experience a loose or splintered board, and can be easily replaced. The use of wood is environmentally friendly as many companies replant the trees they harvest.

To address design impact on access routes, the fishing pier will be placed near the same location that the previous dock was located. This should have no impact on traffic flow & will minimize environmental impacts through permitting requirements of the Corp of Engineers and MDNR/MDEQ. The entire park is accessible by a City maintained road. The park has 80 parking spots for users of the park and launching ramp. If traffic or additional vehicles becomes an issue, the Ludington Police Department will ensure that safety & right of way are maintained through traffic control orders on the incoming access road.

4. Applicant History:

The City of Ludington has no issues of non-compliance with previous DNR recreation grants. The City of






